Dear Sir

It is some time now since you received the balance of amount for the Australian rights of the Synchronome Coy, and yet I have not received any communication from you direct to acknowledge my ???? in the business.

I had thought and anticipated that either yourself or company would have recognized and anticipated the work I have had in the agreement, especially as I obtained for you your own terms in full.

Although delayed in closing through no fault of mine, I have been to considerable expense and time to work this matter, which may be to my advantage and remuneration in the future or may not be as circumstances happen.

I certainly anticipated your allowing some commission out of the transaction, and had left it to your own sense of fair dealing, and the work I have done for you in this matter, which you admit in your letter of April 30th had always been straight forward and prompt.
