Your catalogue and specifications to hand for which I thank you.

I enclose order for Lathe and Parts which I think will suit us best, but I leave it to your good-self to alter this if you think it will not give us the best work, such for instance as the alteration of belt and extra hollow spindle.

I have substituted the Back Traverse Shaft in place of gearing to the leading-screw as it would be more generally useful.

Of course if you have sent on the gear cutters to Messrs Allison previously, omit from this list.

Please notify Messrs Allison and Co when the goods will be ready so that they may be shipped with others in one lot and thus save shipping charges at this end, we will instruct them to draw upon us in London to your account.

We hope you will dispatch as quickly as possible, and see that everything sent is well fitting and complete.
