Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of Sept 16th to me with copy of your letter to Mr Hope-Jones enclosed, and no doubt you have received by the last mail a letter from Mr Knox in answer to yours of Sept 9th.

I dont know that I can send any further information at present, especially as Mr Knox is leaving for London via Hong Kong in a few days and he will carry all information with him.

Letters or parcels may be mailed direct to you for him to wait his arrival.

We are losing contracts every day through not having material, and I think we will have to look to Mr Hope-Jones to reimburse us for this loss.

Enclosed is copy of order to Henry Milnes, Bradford, for Lathe and parts, and we urge the necessity for quick dispatch as we require them for work in hand. We have instructed him to draw and ship through you, as we thought it only fair that you should have commission on all our orders, to somewhat recompense you for the great amount of trouble you have been put to, and we can assure you we shall do our best to place all the business we possibly can in your way. Mr Knox may be in London before these goods are ready.

I may mention that we are just moving into larger premises in Ann Street and are trading under the name of "The Synchronome Electrical Coy of Australasia Ltd", to which place please address all future letters etc.
