Dear Sirs,

My Son, Arthur is leaving her for London by the "Africa" of the White Star Line on the 21st. of February, he is now 16 years of age and I intend him going to Manchester to either attend the Electrical Engineering department of the Municipal Technical College or obtain employment in some large engineering firm staying with my parents who have been generous enough to offer him this advantage. I wish him to call on you, and hope you will show him through your works, and perhaps be kind enough to give him an order to go through your works at Birmingham. My idea is for him to learn in the best way possible good sound electrical knowledge before joining me in the business here, and of course it is to be expected that whatever firm he is most intimate with at Home he will be biased in favour of their goods on returning.
