Dear Mr. Barton,

Herewith I send you under Parcel Post, two samples of Bottle Fillers, also a number of Circulars just printed of same.

You will notice we send one complete with a short stand and the series adaptor, but the other without adaptor as no doubt you can obtain something better looking than the one we had to make up ourselves, no stocks being available.

I enclose herewith a full copy of the Specification with some additions in the wording as marked, from what we sent in previously. The patent office here asked me to more fully describe the switching operation, which I have done in two different ways, this so far has been approved of. When you see the patent Agencies at your end it is possible they may be asked to amend the Patent Specification in the same way and also the claims so you will have the wording as we have it here, on the other hand they may not require it. If you are taking out any new Patents it would be as well to include the new wording at once, although I could not see why an ordinary switching arrangement should have to be described.

No doubt you will get in touch with a good maker both for the metal, and some acid proof substance like Bakelite which would be better than the poor vulcanite we have here. We would like to hear the result and have quotations for two sizes. The No. 1 size for filling the smaller bottles up to say 6 ozs. and a No. 2. Filler – twice the size for 16 oz. bottles like cordial bottles. The trade at your end may be quite different to ours so it would be difficult to decide what would be for the best.

Will write further as things develop.
